#### What is Kwik Cricket

Kwik Cricket is a simple game for all boys and girls from 5 years of age upwards.

It is the result of many years of detailed product development and research by the England and Wales Cricket Board in consultation with cricket coaches, Cricket Development Officers, education authorities, teachers and children.

#### **Kwik Cricket**

#### The Game

The emphasis of Kwik Cricket should always be on participation and enjoyment. In practice any number of children can play, from 2 to 32. Simply adapt the game to your own particular environment in terms of time available and numbers playing. In the booklet included with the kit, we have suggested a number of game formats that can be adapted as necessary.

#### The Kit

Kwik Cricket equipment is made from high quality moulded plastic. It is light enough for small hands yet extremely **tough** and **hard** wearing. It has been designed as an alternative to traditional equipment to allow the game to be played safely on any flat surface either **indoors** or **outdoors** at any time of the year.

Over the years, the equipment has been constantly improved to meet the requirements of today's children, teachers, coaches, young leaders, parents and other adults who help our **future** young cricketers.

#### The standard kit includes the following:

- 2 x Bats (available in 3 sizes)
- 2 x Kwik Balls
- 2 x Sets of stumps (with detachable bases)
- 1 x Simple Instruction Book
- 1 x Holdall.
